His films, including Occupation: A Film About the Harvard Living Wage Sit-In and Bastards of Utopia have shown in festivals around the world. Bastards of Utopia: Living Radical Politics After Socialism, the written companion to the film, was published by Indiana University Press in 2015. He has held fellowships from Stockholm and Harvard Universities, Amherst College, and the Wenner-Gren, Fulbright and Truman Foundations.
